To whom it may concern.

Rotary E-Club One of Denmark is seeking international Global Grant partners for the project 'Defibrillators (AEDs) to Greenland'. Our local liaison is the Greenlandic Red Cross.

AEDs are used to revive patients with a life-threatening cardiac arrest. The project has been recommended by the Danish Heart Association.

- The project includes the purchase of 100 automated external defibrillators of the model Zoll AED Plus, placed in frost-secured cabinets (down to minus 40 C);
- the development of a smartphone app to locate the defibrillator that is closest to a cardiac arrest-patient;
- seeking the co-operation of local taxis in bringing the defibrillator to the patient with heart failure;
- concise flyer instructions in the Greenlandic language. (The AEDs' spoken step-by-step instructions are in Danish, understood by most Greenlanders, but not all);
- the freight expenses between Copenhagen and Nuuk, the capital of Greenland.

The project budget runs 2,5 million Danish crowns (336.100 Euros). We estimate that it could take up to three years to fully implement the project.

Participating Rotary Clubs from other countries will be asked to form a project group of their own with three club members, according to the Global Grant rules.

Our AEDs will be donated to locations in settlements and towns under the supervision of the Greenlandic Red Cross. The AED app will be managed by Greenlandic Red Cross.

Rotary E-Club One of Denmark, with a current membership of 17, will be participating with the amount of 45.000 Danish crowns (circa 6.050 Euros) and will expect partner clubs to offer a similar amount to the project.

Greenland – the world's largest island with a population of only around 56.000 individuals – is a self-governing country within the Kingdom of Denmark. The population is mainly concentrated on the southwest coast of Greenland, while the rest of the island is sparsely populated.
